


Alliance for the Commercialization of Canadian Technology (ACCT) &

Strategic Partner relationship
Overall Strategic Relationship 2006 - Ongoing

Both ACCT and AUTM share the goals and desire to collaborate and coordinate to increase the effectiveness of both parties' activities, for the benefit of our all our members and communities. The parties wish to enter into a relationship to become "Strategic Partners" under this MOU to help all our members achieve their goals. ACCT and AUTM intend that, as a result of this relationship and collaboration, we will strengthen the relationship between ACCT institutions and AUTM in many areas, we have identified key areas of focus for Collaboration moving forward which are:

- AUTM VP Canada has an observer status at ACCT Board Meetings
- Metrics and Survey – New Metrics, this project is underway, there is a separate Letter of Understanding executed between the parties defining the details of this collaboration;
- Developing a single Joint List Serve for Canada, combining AUTM – Can, ACCT and FPTT list servers into one. This will improve communications between all three groups in Canada and reach the greatest number of Canadians;
- Examine areas of future Education projects where ACCT and AUTM could partner;
- Joint interaction and population of the Better World Database with Canadian Stories
- Acknowledge each others organization as Strategic Partners on our respective web sites
- Two complimentary registration fees for board members to attend each others Annual General Meeting; this will build / strengthen future collaborations in specific areas and projects between the organizations

The Parties will from time to time revisit this agreement to revise the list of areas for collaborations upon mutual agreement.
